

At a public meeting of the free
holders of the North Section of Rogers
Hill, on the 25th of October 1866.

M^r. George Campbell was called to
Chair and M^r. Hugh Ross Secretary,
1st Resolution Moved and Seconded, that
in consequence of North and South
Rogers Hill being often confounded,
So that letters and papers have frequen-
tly gone astray. Some means should
be proposed by this meeting to remove
Such confusion.

2nd Resolution Moved and unanimously
carried. That that part of Rogers Hill
north of Fitzpatrick's mountain shall
hence forth be called Scotsburn
and that Pictou shall be the Post
town of said Scotsburn hereafter,
and our way office's designation
shall be Scotsburn way office,
which will be the only means to
rectify the confusion complained of.

3rd Resolution. Moved & carried
that a copy of the above resolutions
be published in the colonial Stand-
-ard and, ^{sent} To Messrs McKay Esq.
and Donald Fraser Esq. our
representatives in the Provincial
Parliament in order to take the
proper steps to confirm the
second resolution.
