

GENERAL REGISTER

The registration of pupils should be made first on temporary sheets of paper in order to allow of the arrangement of names in the most convenient order, to make sure of the correct spelling and to have leisure to make all the entries not only neat and legible but beautiful if possible. No other entry of these names is required during the school year.

The full names (not initials, nicknames or diminutives) of Pupils must be neatly entered in this table, with their ages in years, months and days on the last day of June next, as exactly as can be determined. [In the Annual Return only the year is to be entered, as the Dominion Statistical Office wants, according to general agreement, from every province the age in years last birthday of each pupil on the 30th of June, the end of the School term.] These, with the Pupil's number which must remain unchanged during the year, "notes," "grade at beginning," and the parent or guardian's name and address, must be filled in when the pupil is enrolled. The remaining columns must be filled in before the Annual Return is made at the close of the year. In Graded Schools, when a pupil enrolled in this page is transferred out of this department into another department within the same school section, the name, number, address, etc., must still remain without cancellation; but in the Register of Attendance there must be written neatly (instead of the figures, etc., indicated by their headings) the intimation of the transference of the Pupil into the new department, thus: "Transferred into 4th Dept."—contracted: "Tr. 4th Dept."; or thus: "Tr. to IV. East" or "Tr. to 7th Dept., St. Patrick's," &c., as the case may be—the contracted name of the department being made as brief as required for the short space. It must be carefully remembered that a Pupil's attendance is not transferred out of one department until it is entered into the register of the other department. If a Pupil simply leaves school with the intention of entering another department, or if he attends school in another school section, there is no transference. His name and attendance, etc., must all remain on this page. (There can be no transference out of or into schools, therefore, in School Sections with only one school; and in such schools, of course, the "rectified" attendance will be the same as the "Days" attendance.) The names, etc., of those whose attendance is transferred out of the school must neither be counted nor entered in the Annual Return of this department. "Tr." before the No. of a pupil "transferred out" on this page will facilitate counting the number "on the register." Transfers "out" and "into" occur only occasionally, and only in "Urban" or "Village" schools.

Notes:—Under this head enter when the pupil presents a vaccination certificate the letter "v" followed by the last two figures of the year thus: "v 21" which means "Vaccinated in the year 1921". This record will be equivalent to the annual presentation of the certificate for years after date. Similarly a medical certificate of having had smallpox shall be indicated by the letter "s" followed by the two last figures of the year. Exemption from vaccination on account of a medical health certificate is annual and shall be indicated by the letter "h" and on account of the declaration of a "Conscientious Objector" by the letter "c. o."

Grade at beginning:—Pupils in grade I who are enrolled for the first time at school should be noted as grade "O" instead of "I" in order to distinguish easily when making up statistics between those attending school for the first time and those repeating a year in grade I. "Grade before end" is the one to be given in the return, as "Grade at beginning" may be changed after trial. The school Year ends 31st July; The regular school Term ends 30th June.

The column "Days lost, Compulsory law" is to contain only the days lost by pupils who should be present under the Compulsory Laws of this Province (1) that for Urban schools (6 to 16 years of age), or (2) that for all other schools—village and rural—(7 to 14 years). The Ages in later amendments of the law to be observed.

* All schools (class rooms) in cities and incorporated towns shall henceforth be classed as *Urban* schools; other schools in sections with *more than one* teacher shall be classed as *Village* schools; and all other schools with *only one* teacher in which several grades are taught shall be classed as *Rural* schools. The school statistics of each county shall hereafter be exhibited under these three sub-divisions. The first blank above should be filled in with the appropriate one of these three names. The statistics must contain the information called for by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics as agreed upon by the Provinces of Canada in conference.

If the "*Village*" or "*Rural*" school is "consolidated" (that is, has pupils from a distance "conveyed" and draws also a "consolidation" grant), "Consolidated School" should be written in the space above the name of the section. Blanks should be filled in by a neatly drawn line. The "teacher" in a "rural" school is also "the principal of the schools of the section."
